#### **Strange Days**

Back in January, when I was assigned to Millington, everything seemed pretty normal. I was looking forward to a trip out west to visit my sisters, preparing to sell my house, and envisioning what it was going to be like when I arrived here.

By the time I got out west in March, everything changed. The world was hit by a strange virus. I found myself at my sister's home in California and there was daily talk of closing down all airline travel. I wasn't sure if I would be able to get back home; at least not by flying. I was able to fly back. But it was the strangest flight I've ever taken. Everyone was wearing masks and wiping down their seating areas with various hand sanitizers. From California to Colorado, I was seated next to a delightful young lady who was going home. Her classes at college had been abruptly cancelled, due to the virus situation. The plane was packed with young people in the same situation.

When I got back home, I found Michigan in the early stages of the on-going stay at home order. Therefore, selling the house was put on hold; no one was allowed to visit to take a look.

Three months later I arrived in Millington. It was nothing like I had envisioned back in January. Instead of starting to try to put names to faces-there were only masks and everyone keeping their distance from each other (just a little note: we're not social distancing, we're physically distancing-there is a difference). And, to top it all off, we had social unrest and rioting going on in some of our larger cities. Strange, to say the least; actually, quite disconcerting.

And so, here we are heading into August. There is a lot of fear, anxiety and bewilderment throughout our society; lots of questions. When is this going to be over? When, if ever, will things get back to normal? What's happening to our nation, our society? My answers are-I don't know.

As things have continued on their present course, I, like everyone else, have looked for some comfort, some peace of mind. Good news! I found it, where I always find it-in God's Word, specifically in Psalm 23.

The Lord is my shepherd. I shall not be in want. He makes me to lie down in green pastures, He leads me beside quiet waters, He restores my soul. He guides me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Surely, goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever. (NIV)

Each day brings its challenges to each of us. Even without the current virus, we get sick, we face difficulties and stumbling blocks to our hopes and desires. So, although things seem extremely out of kilter right now, life is actually still the same. We have our ups and downs, we take a few steps forward, and sometimes a step or two back.

His goodness and love are never failing. We just need to keep our minds focused on Him; the One who created all things and sustains all things. Take comfort in knowing that you are a child of God. Even as we face trials and tribulations in these strange days, God is for us and will never let us go.

### Mission Note for August 2020

Usually, in this Missions Note I make comments about some mission in foreign countries or here in the United States or here in Tuscola County.

This month I am going to focus on a situation brought to my attention by a newsletter from St. Joseph's Novitiate where two of my granddaughters are nuns. In this letter the Mother General cited a statement from a Priest Dan Bosco made in 1876. Could a statement made 144 years ago be pertinent for us in our church TODAY? What do you think?

He drew attention to a passage in Matthew 9:35-38. Matthew relates about a time when he was walking with Jesus and his fellow disciples through the villages and countryside, Jesus took note of the "many people who were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd" v36. Then He instructed the Disciples, "The (potential) harvest is plentiful, the workers are few, ask the Lord of the Harvest to send workers into the Harvest field" v37-38.

Do we have people in our towns and countryside who feel harassed and help-less?? Are we called to ask the Lord of the Harvest for workers?? Are any of us who reads this one who may be at least a partial answer to those prayers??


