

I read the headline recently: "Do Celebrities still Matter in a Crisis?" My first thought was a sarcastic: "Did they EVER?" But as I thought about it, they actually DO matter, even if ONLY because we say they do; something that is true for most people and situations.

HOW they matter is a different question.

The Bible has a way of helping us assess the manner in which things/people matter.

Isaiah 36:6 (Good News Translation)

You are expecting Egypt to help you, but that would be like using a reed as a walking stick—it would break and would jab your hand. That is what the king of Egypt is like when anyone relies on him."

Did Egypt – or the King of Egypt – matter? Of course it/he/they did. But in what way?

I read a recent devotional from www.josh.org that included this story:

AN OLD BOY Scout manual told the story of two brothers who were fighting side by side in France. The brothers struggled to rejoin their unit, but only one made it back safely. He approached his commanding officer and asked permission to find his brother.

The officer shook his head. "It's too dangerous," he said, not without pity. "Your brother is probably dead, and there's no use risking your life just to find him dead."

The brother persisted, however, and finally the officer agreed, and the soldier dashed back to hunt for his brother. He finally returned, carrying his brother on his shoulders – but just as he reached safety, his brother gasped and died in his arms.

"You see," said the officer. He clapped a hand on the soldier's shoulder and shook his head. "I let you risk your life for nothing."

"Oh no, sir," the brother answered respectfully. Tears welled in his eyes. "No, sir," he repeated emphatically. "You see, when I crawled up beside him where he lay, hurt and dying, and I took him in my arms, he said, '*I knew you'd come, Tom. I knew you'd come.*'"

"I knew you'd come." SO many things in the world people and corporations and governments and the like all say: "I'll be there for you." But . . . will they really?



We are all aware of who Peter and Kate Walugembe are as missionaries in Uganda. We have met them several times, they and their three lovely children. We have the privilege of helping to support their ministry in Uganda and at times they reach into the refugee camps in South Sudan, a neighboring country to Uganda.

They visited us here in February and had planned to return home (to Uganda) in late March but they are caught here due to the COVID-19 situation which has led Uganda to close its' borders to any one coming into their country.

Uganda so far have had 54 cases there and all of these have been people who had been out of the country and had returned.

We feel hemmed in but the restrictions there are much tighter than ours. If interested, read their letter on the "Mission News" bulletin board to see their restrictions. The question is, are we blessed with less tight restrictions or are we cursed by these same restrictions?

Next, I would like to refer to a poem that was introduced to us by the Pastor of the Manchester UMC in his talk on "Extraordinary connection" entitled "The Summer Day: by Marry Oliver. The final two lines of this poem are:

"Tell me, what is it you plan to do
with your one wild and precious life?"

This is an interesting, thought provoking question. Our busy, action filled lives, to a large extent has slowed quite a lot. How are we using this time, fretting about our slower pace, or relishing this time?

Stewardship Defined

The responsible overseeing and protection of something considered worth caring for and preserving.

We need to manage God's resources in a way that glorifies God. It's not our money, it's God's. Therefore, we are all stewards of the wealth that God has entrusted to us. Don't assume every steward is a good steward. Some stewards look after their own interests, not the interests of their master. A lot of how we view stewardship has to do with how we view money. Is money evil? Is money good? Consider bricks. They can be used to build a beautiful building, or they can be used to break windows in an attempt to steal valuable items. Like bricks, money can be used for good or evil. Remember, money is a tool – it's not inherently good or evil. It's what we do with money that matters. Stewardship extends beyond just tithes and offerings. Having the stewardship mindset will not only improve your giving, but it'll affect your spending and day-to-day activities. The stewardship mindset is one that recognizes that you don't really own anything, you're simply managing it for a certain period of time.

Many Christians struggle between stewardship and building wealth, thinking that they mix like oil and water (not that well). To the contrary, you can pursue wealth while keeping the proper perspective and using it for the glory of God. But be careful, wealth can be deceitful. Don't make money your idol. Seek after the Lord.
