

In addition to these local outreach opportunities, we have several ministries in our county. These ministries are as follows:


- The abused women's shelter in Caro

RaiseRight Gift Card Program



November.....what do you think of when you hear that word?


Do you think about hunting, snow on the ground, leaves gone from the trees, getting ready for Christmas, a family member's birthday?
